In summary, we had 29 boats registered (30 in 2021), 24 started for Bermuda (23 in 2021), 3 turned around, 20 made it to Bermuda of which 2 did not finish. 18 boats started in Bermuda (21 in 2021) for Newport (II Tender stayed in Bermuda due to a broken ankle and Melantho went home to Norfolk, VA), and 18 finished (20 in 2021). Boats came from Sweden, Canada, California, Florida, Minnesota and the usuals from the Virginia area and Maine.

The trip to Bermuda was highlighted (?) by strong Northeast winds leading to and in the Gulf Stream with decent winds the rest of the way to Bermuda resulting in a fast trip (all boats were finished by day 5 however I don't recall anyone saying they had favorable current. Windswept broke his boom and in two pieces and whipped out his comms and Alchemy ripped his mainsail below the 3rd reef; both still finished the race. Melantho lost his electronics including the Autopilot.

The second leg was forecast to have a Southwest breeze for a couple of days. Many serious squalls and a front hit the fleet starting several hours through several days after leaving Bermuda flowed by Northwest breeze followed by Southeast breeze for the slower boats. A lot of the boats were becalmed at different areas some coming into the finish. This was also a fast race with all finishing by the 5th day. II Tender and Melantho did not race.

This year's race was a big improvement on the Covid-19 2021 race. The comradery amongst the skippers was really nice to see. For instance, we had 24 people eating at the Whitehorse restaurant the night before the return start (some skippers do not like to go out the night before the start). We had 22 people at the Swizzle Inn Skipper's Welcome Party, a very successful Fish Fry (wonderful food provided by Brenda and crew) at the Dinghy Club in air conditioning, two tours at Bermuda Radio, a night out at Wahoo's Restaurant, well attended Goslings' Taste and it looked like a lot of purchasing going on and then a very successful Awards and Dinner also in air conditioning. And this time I remembered to have pictures of the singlehanded skippers taken.

We were blessed with 6 new skippers (8 in 2021) starting this year (*Blur* – Peter Gustafsson, *Breakaway* – Gregg Carville (previously sailed by Paul Grimes_), *Envolee* – Nathalie Criou, *Finale* – Thomas O'Connell, *First Light* – Cole Brauer (boat previously skippered by Michael Hennessey which Cole crewed on), and *Saraband* – Elke Backman (some of these "newbies" receive trophies). Four woman started the singlehanded leg; two finished with trophies.
