2016 FALL SKIPPERS' FORUM AND GAM

2017 will mark the 40th year since the establishment of the Bermuda One-Two in 1977, and its organizers think that November 5th would be the perfect opportunity to invite ALL past participants – skippers, crew members, spouses, committee members and the like – to come together to share their personal stories from past events as we start looking forward to next year's race start in June.

Our informal onshore "gam" is planned to begin at 3:30 pm, followed by a participants' forum at 4:00 pm, to which everyone is invited. At this time, information related to next year's race will be provided.

But the REAL party is set start at 5:00/5:30 pm, complete with an ample array of delicious appetizers, and – of course – Dark 'N Stormies being served up at the cash bar.

We envision this soiree as a long-overdue event reunion – a coming together of ALL past event participants of every flavor to visit and swap their Bermuda One-Two sea stories with one another. SKIPPERS' REPRESENTATIVE

For those that may not know Tristan Mouligne continues his reign as the Skippers' Representative. Tristan has been participating in our Race Committee meetings in the preparations leading up to the 2017 Bermuda One-Two as well as racing in both the 2015 and 2016 New England Solo/Twin races. Frank Bohlen has again agreed to do the Gulf Stream

brief at the Skippers' Meeting before the start, the March Skippers' Forum, as well as providing several brief handouts leading up to the race as he did since 2009. Frank gives a tremendous analysis of the Gulf Stream.

POTENTIAL SKIPPERS FOR 2017

The following people have stated that they expect to race in 2017: Clay Burkhalter on J Hawk a J/133 with his uncle Rod Johnstone as return crew, Jack Clayton on Melantho 2 a Cal 33-2, Marcus Cochran on a mini 547, Brian Gray on his mini Trouble No Trouble, Philip Haydon on his Catalina 350 Prairie Gold, Mike Hebert on his C&C 1221 Pointe Blank and return crew Marcos Tonndorf, Michael Hennessey (are the Class 40s back?), Vernon Hultzer on his mini Team Wichard, Eric Johnson, Tony Leigh on his mini 806, Josh Owen on his mini Frogger, Stanley Paris on his new 53 footer, Rick Rohrer on Rocinante a J/109, Roger Shepley on his Omega 42 SV Seriana, Noel Sterett on his J/130 Solarus, Chris Terajewicz on his Morris Justine 36 (another one!) Corvus, John Van Slyke.

We have had a record number of new skippers doing their qualifiers this year. This is great to see; getting the qualifier out of the way minimizing what has to be done getting ready of the race in the spring of 2017.

SKIPPERS AND BOATS

- Stanley Paris is having another boat built, smaller this time 53', in Europe that he plans on racing with us next year and his son Alan his crew for the return.

- We may have three Morris Justine 36' boats in next year's race; veteran of several races Gust Stringos on Bluebird, Zachary Lee on Yankee Girl (who won the double handed division in the Newport Bermuda Race with Gust Stringos) and Chris Terajewicz on Corvus who participated in this year's New England Solo/Twin Single Handed class.

- Michaeal Schum, who was dismasted in last year's race, has another boat and he raced it in the solo class of the Solo/Twin this year; a comfortable Saga 409 In Concert. Will he be able to do the Bermuda One-Two next year?

NOTICE OF RACE FOR 2017

We are working on the Notice of Race for next year and hope to get it out soon after the Skippers' Forum. I thought I would mention some of the changes that are being implemented for 2015.

- Electric flares are now allowed and must meet the manufacturers inspection recommended date.
- Dyneema life lines are no longer allowed however we will grandfather them in for this next race.
- Qualifier increased from a minimum of 24 hours to 30 hours.
- Allow inflatable Dan Buoy vice Man Overboard Module and must meet the manufacturers inspection recommended date.

2016 OFFSHORE 160

The Offshore 160 was held 15-17 July with 11 boats entered. 4 backed out before the start (Samba due to work) so 7 boats started in two classes with 5 finishing. They started in very light wind however there was nice wind for a bunch of the race (of course there were those moments where there was no wind like being becalmed for 6, hours several times). Due to a buoy that was going to be used as a mark being off station two new courses were created and the boats were given the 160nm course. They discovered that the buoy for the new mark was missing so they rounded a virtual mark (the lat/long of the missing mark). The two slowest boats, David Paine on Trifion and Philip Haydon on Prairie Gold (first time to the race and potential Bermuda One-Two skipper next year), got the worst of the light air and withdrew. The boats that finished all received trophies. Mike Piper on his new Elliott 35ss Inigo Montoya was the first boat to finish however due to Paul Grimes on Breakaway finishing 19 minutes behind Mike Piper and Murray Beach on Meridian finishing 43 minutes behind Paul Grimes, Mike corrected to 3rd place, Paul Grimes corrected 1st place and Murray corrected 2nd place all in Class 1. Dan Walsh on his Jeanneau 40 Wild Goose II finished first in Class 2 and Jonathan Bixby on his Tartan 3500 Highlander finished 2nd (without a spinnaker). Both are first timers in the Offshore 160. New skippers to the 160 Mike Piper, Dan Walsh, Jonathan Bixby and Philip Haydon are hopeful for participating in a future Bermuda One-Two. Mike Piper on Inigo Montoya an Elliot 35ss was awarded the William J. Dubuc Trophy for being the first boat to finish. 2016 NEW ENGLAND SOLO/TWIN

This year's Solo/Twin race was held 29/30 July. 33 boats entered this year. We had one solo monohull spinnaker class with 4 participants, one multihull class with 6 participants and the rest were double handed monohulls. For the start predictions of thunder storms and flash floods didn't come through (thankfully). We had rain during the start but quickly

dissipated and the weather became nice. The boats had a nice downwind start. This year the solo class consisted of veteran Bermuda One-Two skipper Michael Schum in his new boat "In Concert", and return leg skipper Noel Sterett and new skipper Chris Terajewicz on Corvus both hoping to do the Bermuda One-Two next year. We moved the Gay Head buoy to a buoy 5 miles out from Gay Head to minimize the current at the Gay Head buoy so it shortened the course form 100 nm to 93 nm. The slower spinnaker class was given the 77 nm course, the non-spinnaker class was given the 65 nm course and the others were given the 93 nm course. Only one multihull out of 6 started but unfortunately they didn't finish. The first boat to finish was veteran Bermuda One-Two team of Fred Cosandey and Ernest Berger on Choucas at 6:56 am Saturday sailing in Class 2 on the 77 nm course. In Class 1 Goat Rodeo a Sequest 36 sailed by Todd and Robert Johnston was the first to finish. Samba, a Quest 30, sailed by Tristan Mouligne and Ted Winston finished first on corrected time in Class 1. Dark Star sailed by Mark Gervais and Carol Tobian (long time participants) finished 1st in corrected time in Class 2. Class 4 was won on both elapsed and corrected time by Larvik a Pearson 10M sailed by Kim Andersen and William Beebe. Benjamin Hodgson, first time sailing singlehanded in the Solo/Twin, on Grimace a J/100 finished first in Class 5, the Solo monohull spinnaker class, both on elapsed and corrected times. Seven boats withdrew this year but six boats didn't show up for the start; 5 of them multihulls.

In its second year, sponsored by Mike Millard, was the New England ShortHanded Ocean Racing Trophy (SHORT) which combines the Offshore 160 (singlehanded) with the New England Solo/Twin (doublehanded) giving a trophy to the best boat that does both races. The idea is to try to promote these races and hopefully into the Bermuda One-Two. The inaugural trophy went to Tristan Mouligne on his Quest 30 Samba in 2014. This year we had four boats that sailed in both races. The winner won his class in the Offshore 160 and was second in a very high powered Class 1. Breakaway sailed by Paul Grimes was the clear winner of this year's SHORT trophy. Congrats, well done.
